Youth will receive 20 baby chicks (pullets). The day old chicks will arrive the week of March 30, 2026-April 3, 2026! You agree to take good care in raising the pullets throughout the summer and return 4 to the Henderson County 4-H Chicken Show and Sale, held during fair week in September. During the show and sale, chickens will be graded, awards given and chickens will be sold at auction to the public. UT Extension will retain the sale profits to buy next year's chicks. You will KEEP THE REST of your hens at home. You are responsible for feed, water, brooding, heat for the first 6 weeks, disease and insect control, housing and fencing. Students not bringing 4 birds back to the sale will be responsible for a \$125 replacement fee!

Chicks are NOT to be allowed outside to run free!!
